INTRODUCTION

Dinnington Town Football Club is a two star England Football accredited club based at **The Blackout13.com Arena** within the Dinnington Resource Centre. This is our central base for all matches, training, and club operations.

The club is a **private company limited by guarantee**, with all committee members serving as directors. This structure ensures the club is managed in a responsible, transparent, and sustainable way for the benefit of players, supporters, and the local community.

Our playing structure is as follows:

- **Baby Phoenix** (ages 2–4)
- **Nursery** (ages 4–6)
- **Junior boys' and girls' teams** from **U7 to U18**
- **Men's U21** – Worksop Van Hire North Development League
- **Men's Reserves** – County Senior Division One (Sheffield & Hallamshire County Senior Football League)
- **Men's First Team** – Central Midlands Alliance Premier Division North
- **Ladies' First Team** – Open Age 1, Sheffield & Hallamshire Women & Girls League
- **Men's O45** - competing in the Wragg league

All teams operate within a single club structure with a clear player development pathway from Baby Phoenix through to open-age football. All coaches are FA-qualified, and safeguarding and welfare are central to club operations.

The club is run entirely by volunteers, including coaches, managers, committee members, matchday staff, and those who maintain facilities. **The Blackout13.com Arena** serves as both our competitive base and a community hub.

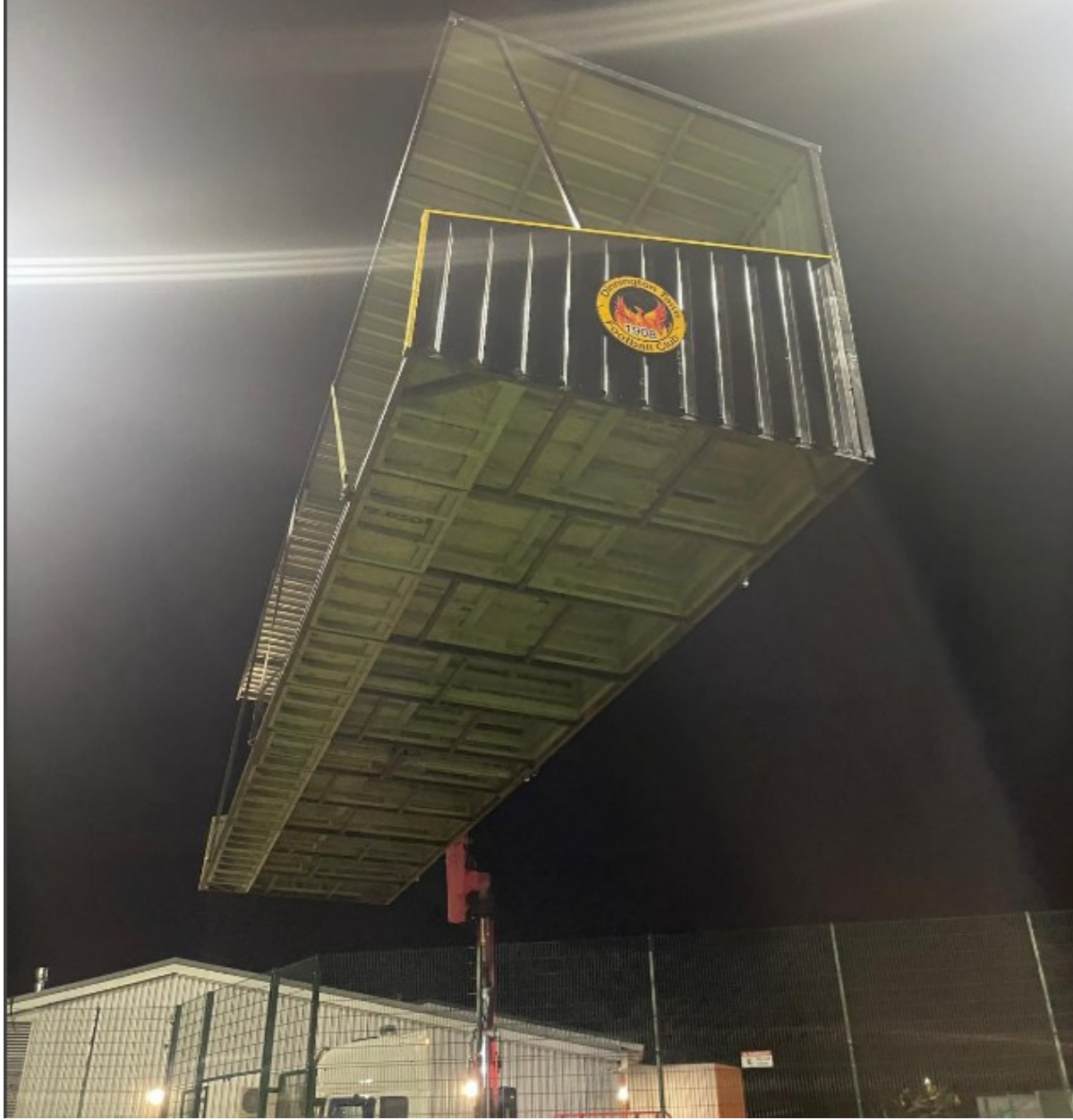

- September 2022 - All teams move back to Phoenix Park for the start of the 2022/23 season.
- 30 March 2023 - 100 seater stand lifted into place.





Dinnington Town Football Club was first founded in 2000 as a men's Saturday League team, competing at Step 8 of the Men's Regional Feeder League System. The club quickly developed a reputation for ambition, and by the early 2010s had reached as high as Step 5, establishing itself as a key part of the South Yorkshire football landscape.

The modern version of the club was first discussed in the car park of The Saxon Pub in Kiveton, where founders Steve Toyne, Chris Dearn, and a group of committed volunteers laid the groundwork for what has become one of the most active grassroots clubs in the region.

Since then, the club has grown significantly. We now run 23 teams covering boys, girls, men's and ladies' football. From Baby Phoenix from aged two to four, through to our senior First Teams. What began as a single squad is now a full club structure built around two operational models:

Centrally Managed Open Age Teams

Our senior squads, the **Men's First Team**, **Ladies' First Team**, **Men's Reserves** and the **Men's U21s** are centrally funded and administered by the committee. All non-footballing decisions are made by the committee, who take responsibility for:

- Finances and budgeting
- Kit and equipment
- Sponsorship and fundraising
- Matchday operations, including running the bar/tuck shop, ticket booth etc
- Discipline, safeguarding, and club governance

This model allows the football staff to focus entirely on coaching and performance, while the club handles the operational side.

Junior & Community Teams

All other teams, primarily in the **junior section** and the **Over 45s**, are run semi-autonomously with less involvement from the Club's management committee. These teams:

- Manage their own budgets and spending
- Collect subs and secure their own sponsors
- Manage training and fixtures
- Player recruitment
- Provide volunteers to run the tuckshop/bar and annual football festivals for which they receive a share of any proceeds.

At the same time, they work within the standards set by the club. This includes:

- Wearing club-approved kit
- Following the club's philosophy and code of conduct
- Centrally organised referee appointments
- Training and match schedules coordinated at club level

They pay a membership fee to the club, which covers:

- Weekly access to training and match facilities
- Two annual social events provided by the club
- An organised End of Season Awards Night, with trophies and event costs covered centrally

This hybrid model allows the club to grow sustainably, support ambitious senior teams, and empower junior volunteers to manage their own sections effectively, all while ensuring every player, coach, and parent remains part of one unified club.



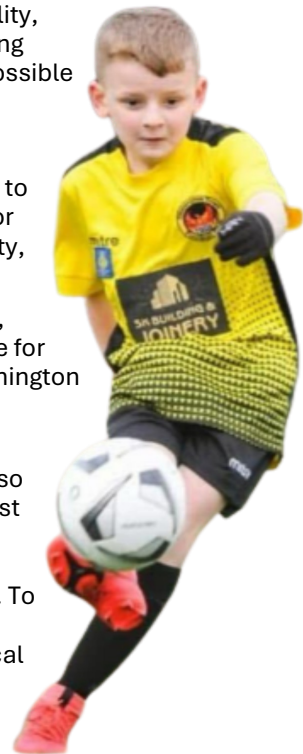
PHILOSOPHY



Dinnington Town Football Club exists to provide high-quality, inclusive football for the local community, while developing players and teams capable of competing at the highest possible level.

Our approach is built on the following principles:

- **Player development first** – Every player is supported to reach their full potential, regardless of starting point or ability, through structured coaching, equal opportunity, and clear progression.
- **Pathway to the top** – From Baby Phoenix to our U21s, Reserves, and First Teams, we provide a defined route for talented players to progress into adult football at Dinnington Town.
- **Performance with Purpose** – While enjoyment and participation remain at the heart of what we do, we also expect and support our teams to perform at the highest level possible. Our aim is to develop players who can represent Dinnington Town at senior level and, where possible, progress into the highest levels of the game. To achieve this, managers are encouraged to recruit the strongest players available, ensuring that talented local players are surrounded by quality and given the best chance to grow and succeed.

- **One club culture** – All players, coaches, and volunteers work to the same standards of discipline, commitment, and respect, whether in junior or senior football.
- **Community commitment** – We are rooted in Dinnington and will always remain accessible. The club is powered by volunteers and built on values of inclusion, respect, and positive behaviour.
- **Consistent football philosophy** – Across all age groups, we encourage technically capable, confident, and adaptable players who can make good decisions, play with creativity, and contribute to the team.

This balance between development, performance, and community ensures that Dinnington Town remains both a place where anyone can belong and a club that produces players ready to succeed at the highest level.



MISSION STATEMENT



At Dinnington Town Football Club, we are committed to delivering football for all, built on enjoyment, discipline, and ambition. Our mission follows a clear pathway through three stages, the same for boys and girls, designed to provide inclusive opportunities while pushing every player to fulfil their potential.

1. Foundations of Fun & Discipline (Up to U11)

For our youngest players, football must first and foremost be enjoyable. Up to U11, our focus is on creating an environment where children fall in love with the game. Every session and every match should bring a smile, while also instilling the **discipline, drive, and respect** set out in our philosophy. These foundations are critical: by learning good habits early, our players are prepared to develop further as they grow.

2. Performance with Purpose (U12 to U18 / U16 Girls)

From U12 onwards, we turn our attention to performance. This doesn't mean abandoning enjoyment, but it does mean raising standards. Our goal is for our teams to compete in the **higher divisions (A–C)** where possible, testing themselves against the best opposition. The aim is to create an environment where talented players are stretched, supported, and challenged to reach their potential.

Performance with purpose means every match, every training session, and every opportunity has a clear direction: **developing players capable of progressing into senior football**. This stage is where we teach resilience, tactical understanding, leadership, and commitment. It is about producing young players ready to represent Dinnington Town at the highest levels of the grassroots game, while still ensuring inclusivity and opportunity for all.





3. Senior Teams - Open Age & U21

Now we're at the final frontier: senior football, where ambition meets accountability.

- **Men's First Team** - We expect them to be competing at **Step 6** with a clear trajectory towards **Step 5**.
- **Reserves** - A vital stepping stone at **Step 7**, helping bridge youth into open-age demands.
- **U21s** - A proving ground for emerging talent, offering a competitive platform and easing transition into adult football.
- **Ladies Team** - Our goal is for them to be performing **strongly at Step 6**, competing in the North East Regional Women's Football League Division 1, feeding into the higher regional tiers

Across all senior levels, our expectation is high performance aligned with purpose, maintaining strong competition, building sustainable progression, and delivering the kind of football that our community can be proud of.

At Dinnington Town, enjoyment builds foundations, performance shapes players, and senior ambition drives standards.

7-a-side on smaller pitches (pprox half full size) for U9 and U10, still reduced rules and non-competitive, no leagues or results can be published. 9-a-side for U11s and U12s, offside, heading and throw in's introduced. Competitive matches - results and tables are published.



4 U13-U14

11-a-side football on a reduced size full pitch. Full rules. Competitive matches, results and league tables published.



2 U7 & U8

Matches start at U7 on quarter of a pitch and with reduced rules i.e. no offside, no heading, kick-ins. Non-competitive matches, results cannot be published. Junior Football, up to U16 is played in the Sheffield & District Junior Sunday League



5 U15 & U16

Full sized pitch. Full rules. Competitive matches, results and league tables published.



6 U18

The club currently choose not to have an U17 team and combine both ages into one U18 team in the Meadowhall league, giving the team two years at this level.



7 U21

Our U21 team compete in the North Midlands Development league which requires teams to be of a high standard and is only avialable to clubs with a First Team playing at Step 7 or higher. Managers from this point forwards are appointed by the committee.



9 FIRST TEAM

Our Mens First Team compete in the Central Midlands Alliance Premier Division North (Step 7) and represent the pinnacle of Mens football at Dinnington Town.

8 RESERVES

Open age mens football competing in the Sheffield and Hallamshire County Senior League Division 1 (Step 8).

For Coaches and Team Staff

- **Prioritise development** – Focus on long-term growth, not short-term results, while preparing players to compete at the highest level they can reach.
- **Maintain high standards** – Be qualified, organised, and consistent in your approach. Lead by example in everything you do.
- **Communicate well** – Build honest, respectful relationships with players and parents. Feedback should be clear, constructive, and age-appropriate.
- **Create the right environment** – Sessions and matches should be positive, challenging, and inclusive, with safeguarding and player welfare always at the forefront.

For Parents and Supporters

- **Support, don't instruct** – Let the coaches coach. Encourage effort, not just outcomes.
- **Respect everyone** – That includes referees, opponents, club volunteers, and other families.
- **Trust the process** – Development takes time. Selection and game time will always be based on what's best for the player and the team.
- **Be part of the club** – Dinnington is run entirely by volunteers. Your help, positivity, and example shape the club's culture.





Safeguarding & Welfare

Dinnington Town Football Club is fully committed to maintaining a safe, inclusive, and professional environment. Our safeguarding and welfare standards reflect both best practice and FA requirements for all volunteers, coaches, and committee members.

Minimum Qualifications & Compliance

All volunteers are required to meet the following standards:

- **DBS Checks:**

All coaches, helpers, and committee members must hold a valid FA-issued DBS check, renewed every three years.

- **Safeguarding Training:**

Those working directly with youth (U18s) must complete the **Safeguarding Children Course** (or recertification every two years) or complete safeguarding as part of the **Introduction to Coaching Football** course. Managers of adult teams must complete the **Player Welfare in Open Age Football** course

Committee members must complete the **Safeguarding for Committee Members** course, which covers safer recruitment, reporting mechanisms, and building safeguarding culture.

- **First Aid:**

A qualified first aider must be present at all sessions and matches. This is fulfilled by completing the **Introduction to First Aid in Football** course - valid for three years - or a higher-level FA medical qualification.

SAFEGUARDING AND WELFARE

- **Coaching Qualifications:**

Team Managers and Coaches must hold a minimum of the **FA Level 1** (formerly "Introduction to Coaching Football") qualification.

Assistant coaches and helpers may hold the **FA Playmaker** qualification as a foundational level.

By ensuring every role meets these standards, Dinnington Town FC protects our players, supports our staff, and maintains integrity throughout the club. The FA allows individuals from the age of 14 to begin their journey by completing the FA Referee Course, which combines online learning, safeguarding, and practical training.

Why We Encourage Young Officials

At Dinnington Town, we want our players to see refereeing as a brilliant opportunity alongside playing. It offers a way to earn a bit of money, develop decision-making skills, build confidence in managing pressure, and gain valuable leadership experience. Many referees say the qualities they develop on the pitch - resilience, communication, and fairness - help them just as much off it.





What We Offer at Dinnington

- **Course Support** – We pay the full cost of the FA Referee Course, and guide our players towards the right opportunities to enrol.
- **Early Opportunities** – Once qualified and registered with the FA and the Sheffield & District Junior Sunday League, referees under 16 are given opportunities to take charge of junior fixtures within our club, gaining practical experience in a supportive environment.
- **Progression Pathways** – From the age of 16, referees become eligible to officiate open age friendlies for the club. For those wishing to progress further, we can help introduce them to local leagues and referee associations to continue their development.
- **Mentoring & Guidance** – Wherever possible, we link our young referees with experienced officials within the club to give feedback, encouragement, and advice.
